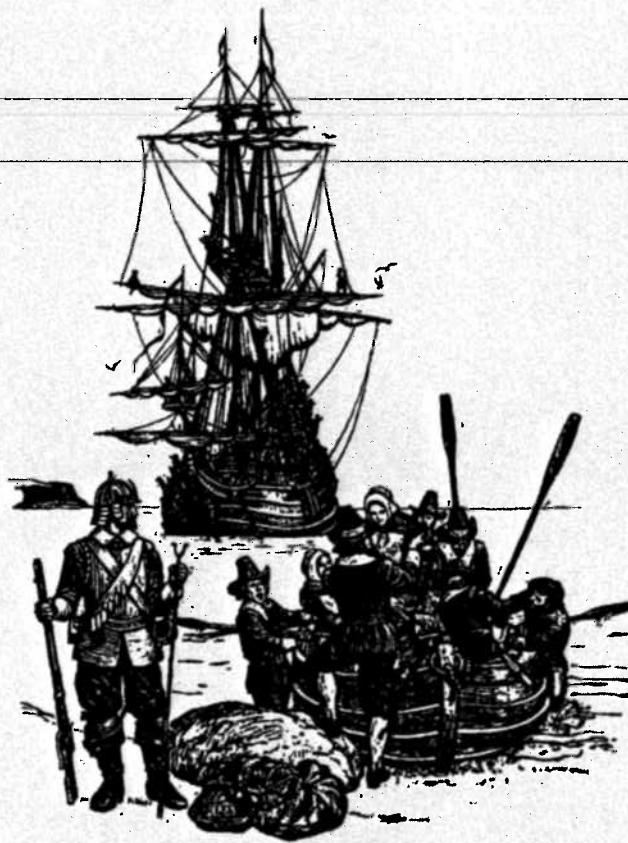

First Generation

1. William Brewster [72], [240], [283], [756], [1024], [1142], [1607], [2133], 10G Grandfather, M. Born in 1567 in Doncaster, Yorkshire, England. [72, States born about 1563.], [1024], [1607] William died in Plymouth, Massachusetts, on 16 Apr 1644; he was 77. [2], [1024], [1607] Mayflower Passenger 1620.

William was the head of the Plymouth Colony and as underground agent in England for the pilgrims of Leyden, Holland, had help from an old Cambridge University chum, Robert Devereux, Earl of Essex. [240]

Mayflower Index: William Brewster, the Pilgrim and Mary #4871. [1614]

Elder William Brewster was a Pilgrim colonist leader and preacher who came from Scrooby, in north Nottinghamshire and reached what became the Plymouth Colony in the Mayflower in 1620. He was accompanied by his wife, Mary Brewster, and his sons, Love Brewster and Wrestling Brewster. Son Jonathan joined the family in November 1621, arriving at Plymouth on the ship Fortune, and daughters Patience and Fear arrived in July 1623 aboard the Anne.

Biography

Origins

He was the son of William Brewster and Mary Smyth and he had a number of half-siblings. His paternal grandparents were William Brewster and Maud Mann. His maternal grandfather was Thomas Smyth. Brewster may have been born in Doncaster.

Scrooby Manor was in the possession of the Archbishops of York. Brewster's father, William senior, had been the estate bailiff for the archbishop for thirty-one years from around 1580. With this post went that of postmaster, which was a more important one than it might have been in a village not situated on the Great North Road, as Scrooby was then.

William Junior studied briefly at Peterhouse, Cambridge before entering the service of William Davidson in 1584. In 1585, Davidson went to the Netherlands to negotiate an alliance with the States-General. In 1586, Davidson was appointed assistant to Queen Elizabeth's Secretary of State Francis Walsingham, but in 1587 Davidson lost the favour of Elizabeth, after the beheading of her cousin (once removed) Mary, Queen of Scots.

Dissent

Cambridge was a centre of thought concerning religious reformism, but Brewster's time in the Netherlands, in connection with Davidson's work, gave him opportunity to hear and see more of reformed religion. While, earlier in the sixteenth century, reformers had hoped to amend the Anglican church, by the end of it, many were looking toward splitting from it. (See Brownist).

On Davidson's disgrace, Brewster returned to Scrooby. There, from 1590 to 1607, he held the position of postmaster. As such he was responsible for the provision of stage horses for the mails, having previously, for a short time, assisted his father in that office. By the 1590s, Brewster's brother, James, was a rather rebellious Anglican priest, vicar of the parish of Sutton cum Lound, in Nottinghamshire. From 1594, it fell to James to appoint curates to Scrooby church so that Brewster, James and leading members of the Scrooby congregation were brought before the ecclesiastical court for their dissent. They were set on a path of separation from the Anglican Church. From about 1602, Scrooby Manor, Brewster's home, became a meeting place for the dissenting Puritans. In 1606, they formed the Separatist Church of Scrooby.

Emigration

Restrictions and pressures applied by the authorities convinced the congregation of a need to emigrate to the more

sympathetic atmosphere of Holland, but leaving England without permission was illegal at the time, so that departure was a complex matter. On its first attempt, in 1607, the group was arrested at Scotia Creek, but in 1608 Brewster and others were successful in leaving from The Humber. In 1609, he was selected as ruling elder of the congregation.

Initially, the Pilgrims settled in Amsterdam, and worshipped with the Ancient Church of Francis Johsonson and Henry Ainsworth. Offput by the bickering between the two, though (which ultimately resulted in a division of the Church), the Pilgrims left Amsterdam and moved to Leiden, after only a year.

In Leiden, the group managed to make a living. Brewster taught English and later, in 1616-1619, printed and published religious books for sale in England though they were proscribed there, as the partner of one Thomas Brewer. In 1619, the printing type was seized by the authorities under pressure from the English ambassador Sir Dudley Carleton and Brewster's partner was arrested. Brewster escaped and, with the help of Robert Cushman, obtained a land patent from the London Virginia Company on behalf of himself and his colleagues.

The Pilgrims lived in the city of Leiden between 1609 and 1620. They worked in crafts and trades to support their families.

Towards the end of the Pilgrims' stay in Leiden, William Brewster operated a printing press. Between 1617 and 1619, this press, known informally today as the "Pilgrim press," printed and distributed controversial religious books. These books were banned by English law and had to be smuggled into the country.

Brewster printed two books by David Calderwood that were directly critical of King James I of England. The English ambassador to Holland instigated a search for William Brewster and his press. Brewster went into hiding but his house in Leiden was searched and his printing type seized. The next year, the Pilgrims journeyed to Plymouth on the Mayflower. The Pilgrims never set up a press in Plymouth and, in fact, there were no presses in Plymouth until the late 18th century.

Several of the "Brewster imprints" published by the "Pilgrim press" in Leiden feature the "Brewster bear."

The Library of the Pilgrim Society contains a number of "Pilgrim press" books, available to scholarly researchers by appointment. A small selection of the "Pilgrim press" books is always on display in Pilgrim Hall, Plymouth, Massachusetts.

In 1620 he joined the first group of Pilgrims aboard the Mayflower on the voyage to North America. When the colonists landed at Plymouth, Brewster became the senior elder of the colony, serving as its religious leader and as an advisor to Governor William Bradford.

As the only university educated member of the colony, Brewster took the part of the colony's religious leader until a pastor, Ralph Smith, arrived in 1629. Thereafter, he continued to preach irregularly until his death in April 1644.

Brewster was granted land amongst the islands of Boston Harbor, and four of the outer islands (Great Brewster, Little Brewster, Middle Brewster and Outer Brewster) now bear his name.[1][2]

Descendants

A rare 17th-century "Brewster Chair," named after the original owned by William Brewster [1]William Brewster married Mary, whose maiden name is unknown. During much of the 20th century she was thought to be the daughter of Thomas Wentworth, however there is no compelling evidence to support this. More recent speculation suggests her maiden name was Wyrall, but again the evidence is weak at best.

There are many notable descendants of William Brewster, including Zachary Taylor, Cokie Roberts, Roger Nash Baldwin, Katharine Hepburn, Bing Crosby, William Brewster, Brewster Shaw, Lyndon LaRouche, George B.

He married Mary [72], [245], [756], [1024], [1142], [1607], 10G Grandmother, F, in 1590 in Scrooby, Nottingham, England. [2], [1024], [1607, Before 1593.] Born abt 1569 in England. [1024], [1607] Mary died in Plymouth, Massachusetts, on 17 Apr 1627; she was 58. [2], [1024], [1607]

The quest for the identity of Mary, the wife of William Brewster, has attracted the attention of many genealogists, but as yet without a definitive result. For some time she had been thought to be Mary Wentworth, daughter of Thomas Wentworth of Scrooby, and in 1965 John G. Hunt presented his case in favor of this identity [TAG 41:1-5, 63], but this claim was rejected by Rubincam and others, and Hunt himself has now given up this position. He has, however, published a pamphlet claiming that she was a certain Mary Wyrall, based on the appearance in a will of a bequest to "Mary Butho," which Hunt took to be a variant of Brewster resulting from a speech defect in the person dictating the will [John G. Hunt, *Of Mary Brewster: The Identity of Mary, Wife of Elder William Brewster of the Mayflower Voyage of 1620 from Plymouth, England, to New Plymouth, New England (Bowling Green, Virginia, 1984)*].

Eugene A. Stratton reviewed this volume negatively in 1985 [DSGRM 48:135-36], to which Hunt responded with a supplement to his pamphlet [*Of Mary Brewster, part two (Bowling Green, Virginia, August 1985)*]. The maiden surname of Mary, wife of Elder Brewster, remains unknown. (Hunt has published other articles on various aspects of William Brewster's life which, as with all of Hunt's work, need to be used with caution: "'Master Williamson' of the Mayflower" [NGSQ 62:88-90]; "The Mother of Elder William Brewster of the Mayflower" [NEHGR 124:250-56]; "Mary Stubbe - A Connection of Elder William Brewster?" [NEHGR 128:288-90].) [245]

She married Isaac Allerton [72], [245], [283], [358], [791], [836], [1319], M, on 22 May 1627 in Plymouth, Massachusetts. [2] Born in 1586 in Suffolk, England. [2], [283], [629] Isaac died in New Haven, Connecticut, in 1659; he was 73. [2], [240] Buried in 1659 in New Haven, Connecticut. [2], [240] Only Mayflower Passenger to be buried in Connecticut.

Mr. Isaac Allerton, of London, Merchant, with wife Mary and their son Bartholomew, who returned to England, their daughters Remember who married Moses Maverick, and Mary who married Thomas Cushman along with a servant, John Hooke, arrived on the Mayflower in Plymouth in 1620. [36]

Isaac, one of the founders of the Plymouth Plantation in 1620, fifth signer of the Mayflower Compact, was also one of the founders of Marblehead, Massachusetts. [60] [240]

He came to Marblehead from the Plymouth Colony because of his tendencies toward speculation and personal "free trade" which eventually made him "persona non grata".

On February 1, 1634 at Little Harbor, Marblehead, at Mr. Cradock's house, where Mr. Allerton and many fisherman whom he had employed that season were all present, the house caught fire. Everyone escaped, although loosing all their goods inside, because Mr. Allerton, a tailor, was up all night at work and hearing a noise, looked out and saw the house on fire above the oven in the thatch. [240]

Isaac, his wife and three children are listed by Bradford as having, "Came over first, in ye year 1620." [40]

Isaac Allerton was one of the original Pilgrim fathers who came on the Mayflower to settle the Plymouth Colony in 1620. Allerton is an ancestor to Presidents of the United States Zachary Taylor and Franklin D. Roosevelt.

He is believed to have been born in London, England, about 1585 or 1586 and was raised to become a tailor. A religious non-conformist, he apparently followed the Scrooby exiles to Leiden, Holland as a young man. There he married his first wife, Mary Norris, in November 1611.

Accompanying Isaac and Mary on the Mayflower were their three children: Bartholemew, Remember, and Mary, and a servant boy named John Hooke. Allerton's wife and Hooke died in the first winter at the Plymouth Colony. Allerton also had a stillborn son by his wife Mary while they were on the ship in Plymouth Harbor. Allerton remarried to Fear Brewster, the daughter of William Brewster in 1626. With her he had another son naming him Isaac Allerton Jr.

Allerton quickly rose to prominence among the Pilgrim leaders, serving as William Bradford's assistant governor during the early years of the colony. After the adoption of a more formalized governmental structure in 1624, he served again as one of five assistant governors. In 1627, he became one of the eight "undertakers" of the colony's debt and made several voyages to London to negotiate with the colony's creditors.

Allerton the Businessman

While serving as the colony's business agent, Allerton began several business ventures of his own, relying on the colony's credit for collateral. These ventures failed, thus leaving his colleagues back in Plymouth saddled with a greatly increased debt. Also, Allerton was asked to bring over trade goods to sell to the natives, however, Allerton brought over retail goods to sell to the colonists and fishermen who came over every year. Later on Allerton did not mark which goods were his and which belonged to the colony. When the goods were unloaded, Allerton took the most expensive items leaving the Plymouth colonists with the cheaper goods. In 1629 Allerton brought Thomas Morton back to New England, and allowed him to live in his house; this got the Plymouth colonists very upset. This rendered Allerton permanently persona non grata in Plymouth.

Bradford wrote: "Mr. Allerton played his own game and ran a course not only to the great wrong and detrement of the Plantation... but abused them in England also in prejudice against the Plantation," and later on he wrote "Concerning Mr. Allerton's accounts. They were so large and intricate as they could not well understand them, much less examine and correct them without a great deal of time and help and his own presence, which was hard to get," and also "he screwed up his poor father in law's account".

Settling in Marblehead, Massachusetts, Allerton established a profitable fishing business. Fear Brewster died in 1634, and Allerton married Joanna Swinnerton sometime between 1634 and 1644. He was soon commanded by the Massachusetts authorities to leave the colony. He relocated to New Amsterdam in 1643. Two years later, he moved again to the new English settlement at New Haven, Connecticut, where he continued his activities as a merchant.

Allerton died in February 1659 in New Haven and was buried under the town common. Although his estate, when inventoried, appeared to be large, he was in fact found to have died insolvent. [629]

DESCENDANTS OF JAMES STACKPOLE OF
THOMASTON, ME.

James Stackpole (James³, Philip², James) son of James and Elizabeth (Pierce) Stackpole, was born in Somersworth, N. H. 1 May 1744 O. S. With his brother William he went to Harpswell, Me., and for several years they were residents of the Island called Sebascodegan, now known as Great Island. A petition, dated 25 May 1768, was sent to the General Court of Mass. by its inhabitants, called in the petition an "island alias Shapleigh Island." The petitioners ask "to be erected into a distinct separate precinct, that we may enjoy the privileges of the Gospel, in common with other Christians, in a more decent and convenient manner." It is signed by James Stackpole and by William Stackpole.* James married, 18 May 1767, Judith Thompson† of Brunswick, Me., who was born 8 Feb. 1743 and died at Thomaston, Me. 13 April 1797. They were married by the Rev. Samuel Eaton of Harpswell.

April 16 1773, James and Judith Stacpole (sic) sold to Isaac

†James Thompson belonged in Kittery, Me. as early as 1696. He owned land in York in 1701, moved to York in 1709 and to New Meadows, Brunswick, in 1727. He may have been son of Miles Thompson of Kittery or of John Thompson called the Scotchman. He married Sarah, dau. of Adrian Frye of Kittery. Three sons went with him to Brunswick, viz., James b. 1707, father of Brig. Gen. Samuel Thompson of Brunswick; Cornelius, b. 14 Oct. 1709 and m. Hannah Smith; and Joseph who married Mary ——— and died before 1759. The last was living on Sebascodegan in 1756 and was the father of Judith Thompson who married James Stackpole.

Snow 37 acres being parts of lot 13 and 15 on Sebascodegan and bordering on New Meadows River, and moved to Thomaston, Me., where he purchased a farm of James Fales and "settled along the Bay of George's River towards Simonton Point."* He was a carpenter and mason as well as farmer. Was Town Clerk in 1778 and Treasurer in 1784 and 1802. His second wife was Mrs. Sarah (Fales) Partridge. They were married 23 November, 1797. No children by this marriage. He died 23 May 1814, respected and honored by his fellow-citizens. Eleven children, viz., Olive, Aaron, Aaron 2d, an infant, Joseph, Elizabeth, James, Cornelius, Betsey, William and Judith.
