Hello Paul:

I saw your family roots website and maybe I can provide a few hints, from my own research experience in 2002. I'm age 76, live in Bothell, WA (near Seattle). My paternal grandfather (Andreas Kimak-Fejko) was born in 1867, in house #40, also in KAPISOVA! I'm sure our ancestors were acquainted because my family was there from at least 1857 to 1892, and only 43 houses existed there during the 1869 Hungarian Census. Those documents are very revealing. It will provide information about your great-grandparents and maybe your great-great-grandparents, such as year and village of birth, occupation, livestock count, owner or renter of the house, etc.

This information is available at the nearest Mormon (LDS) church near you. They will acquire the rolls of microfilm and you can read them (and make copies) at the church's library. It costs about 5 dollars a roll and you have about a month to use them. Go there and order these 2 rolls if you haven't already done it.

Scan the nearby villages listed on each roll. Copy every page that has your ancestral names.
